
- A Consultant Speech Therapist and Audiologist -Bianca (also our Social Media expert and photographer!)

AFRIKA TIKKUN Sabrina Love Learner Facilitator Training Programme.

With our 18 years of supporting, treating and advocating for children with disabilities, and with our vision and experience of inspiring inclusion within schools, we presented our first workshop to 33 teachers. social workers and learner assistants from Afrika Tikkun in Cape Town - An Introduction to **Disability and Inclusion**.

Our take home message was from the work of Pudlas (2006). Too many training programmes tend to focus on the 'head' (theory) and the 'hands' (skills) with very little assessment of the 'heart'.



True inclusion begins not with what we know (head) or what we can do (hands) but with who we are (heart).

MEETING DR SIGAMONEY NAIKER Chief Director: Inclusive Education and Special Programmes Western Cape Education Department



It was a priviledge to meet Dr Naiker who accompanied a delegation to Plettenberg Bay.

Dr Naiker was instrumental in the writing of the Government White Paper 6 passed into law in 2001 -**Building an Inclusive Education and Training System** in South Africa.

We had the opportunity of sharing our work on Inclusion in mainstream schools with him. He was overwhelmed by our projects, learner facilitator programme and the number of children with disabilities that we support in local schools.

On the 3rd of November, we were invited to attend and present at the annual AT Disability Symposium.

Our brief was to give an account of our Inclusion journey in Plettenberg Bay to date - the challenges, the successes, the barriers, the way forward with the inclusion of children with disabilities in mainstream education.

It became clear that Sabrina Love is at the forefront of Inclusive Education in South Africa - we are, perhaps, the only NPO tackling Inclusion actively in the country.

We were thrilled to share the stage with Mr Faleni, the Headmaster at Kwanokuthula Primary School, who is a passionate advocate of Inclusion.

We met and sat alongside the National Minister of Inclusive Education, Mr Jabulani Ncgobo and a Minister from Woman, Children and People with Disabilities, Phuiti Mabelebele.

We look forward to Government officials visiting Plett and seeing the work that SLF is doing in terms of Inclusion. We have taken the White Paper 6 from 2003 and instead of just talking about it, we are doing it!

2 NEW DEAF LEARNER FACILITATORS Beauty and Charmilyn

Beauty has a history with Sabrina Love Foundation. She was a part of the Foundation as a child and then attended De La Bat School for the Deaf in Cape Town. Her story is an emotional one, having been sent to boarding school at the age of 6 years old.

Beauty is profoundly deaf. She uses Sign Language as her main mode of communication.

Charmilyn is also profoundly deaf and fluent in South African Sign Language.







Our Hearing Impairment Project began in January 2022 as an inspired response to the hearing needs of our community. This project has been run and led by the therapists and team at The Sabrina Love Foundation.



Moving forward with Inclusive Education for Children with Disabilities in South Africa

The Sabrina Love Foundation Learner Facilitation Programme

- We partner with **7 local mainstream primary schools and creches**. These partnerships with our 'Inclusion Ambassador schools, has been a process of negotiation, advocacy, building trusting relationships of support and the provision of essential technology resources.
- We also provide a vital element which is missing from all government guidelines, strategies and planning documents - Learner Facilitators.
- Without the provision of Learner Facilitators, we would never have been able to convince schools to take our children, the disabled children would not have been able to access learning in the manner in which they have and the schools, teachers, peers and parents would not have had the **invaluable experience of diversity** within their schools.
- Our team of therapists has trained our staff by providing practical workshops, theoretical modules and on-the-job experience in classrooms.
- We have **14 fulltime Learner Facilitators** at present both male and female
- All Learner Facilitators have matric or the equivalent NQF level 4 and some have NQF level 5/6 in Early Childhood Development.
- The Sabrina Love Foundation has found that it is more important that the individual's chosen for our learner facilitator programme have passion and the right temperament to work with children with individual needs and disabilities rather than any formal education.



Our Learner Facilitator Programme

The Sabrina Love Foundation has been training its own team of Learner Facilitators for many In 2022 we initiated this years. training programme with teachers, teachers assistants and social workers from AfrikaTikkun. Our goal is to upscale our Training Programme and proceed with the accreditation process in collaboration with AfrikaTikkun and the University of Stellenbosch.


